


Clint Lounsbury

<u>TID-BITS of PROTOCOL;</u>......<u>from the Adjutant's desk</u>





- A) The Flag was authorized by Congress on June 14, 1777, (Flag Day) and it was decreed that there would be 1 star and 1 stripe for each State which at that time meant 13 of each.
- B) As Vermont in 1791 and Kentucky in 1792 became States and were added it became obvious that there would be too many stripes. So in 1818 Congress reduced and restricted the number of stripes to represent the 13 original colonies and declared that a single star be added for each State.
- C) The colors are explained as;

Red is for valor, zeal, and fervency. **White** is for hope, purity, cleanliness of life and rectitude. **Blue** is for the color of the heavens, for reverence to God, loyalty, sincerity, Justice and truth.

D) The Star is an ancient symbol of India, Persia and Egypt that symbolizes dominion and sovereignty, As well as lofty aspirations.

The symbolism of the Flag was thus interpreted by George Washington: "We take the **stars** from the heavens, the **red** from our mother country, separating it by **white** stripes, thus showing that we have separated from her, and the **white stripes** shall go down to posterity representing liberty."

A lot has changed since the times of "A Christmas Story". One thing that hasn't changed is the danger of a "BB" gun in the hands of an untrained child. American Legion Post 16 is trying to do something about that, and also to promote the Shooting Sports as an activity in our community.

The Post is sponsoring a competitive Air Rifle Shooting Club for youth aged 10 through 18. Relationship to a member of the American Legion is NOT required. The club is open to all children in the proper age bracket. There will be adult supervision at all club events. An eight section Air Rifle Safety Course will be taught at the first several club meetings, and each club member will be required to pass an examination before being allowed to handle the air rifles without "up close and personal" supervision. There is a \$25 initial entry fee and a Yearly dues of \$20.00 for each member.
